Ideally, each country should form a team with a maximum of 9 people:

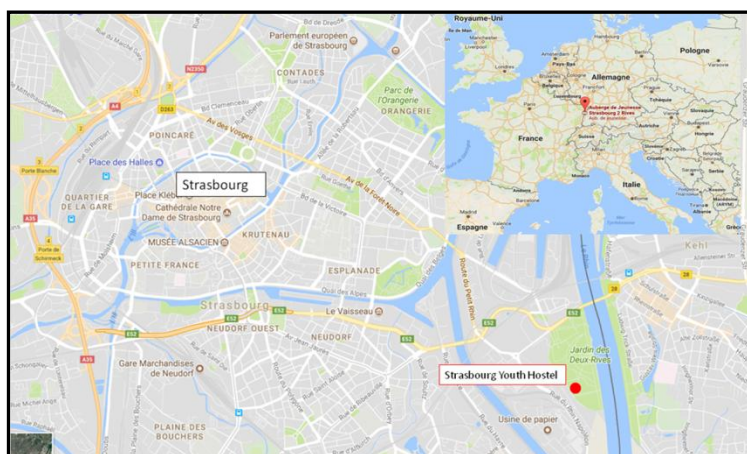
- 6 youth participants (14 - 18), ideally a combination of men and women.
- 2 to 3 accompanying adults for leadership and coaching purposes.

The cost is 350.00 euros per person. This fee covers:

- Full room and board from dinner on the 6 July 2018 until breakfast on the 10 July 2018.
- All activities and outings featured on the camp programme.

Return travel from country of origin and camp location is not included. Of course, we will try and arrange solutions to help with travel between the Strasbourg train station or airport and the accommodation site.

Camp Accommodation



Accommodation will be at the **Strasbourg - 2 Rives Youth Hostel**.

Located on the banks of the **Rhine**, in the lush green surroundings of Jardin 2 Rives, the hostel is truly at the heart of Europe!

This contemporary youth hostel is only 12 minutes on foot from the “Pont du Rhin” bus stop, and 5km from the Strasbourg Cathedral.

Room facilities range from 2 to 8 beds (bunk beds in some cases) and have either a shared bathroom or en-suite, depending on the room. Youth participants will be housed in groups of 2 to 6, depending on availability and group configurations (single sex accommodation only).



Upon request, group leaders may have the option of individual rooms.

There is free Wi-Fi. The youth hostel also has a common kitchen, a terrace and bar. It offers a T.V. room, a barbecue area and a garden.

The Jardin des Deux Rives is the symbol of Franco-German friendship. This 150-hectare park along the banks of the Rhine passes alongside the Pont de l'Europe. Just a stone's throw from both Strasbourg and Kehl, it provides a unique meeting place and walking area where cultural events are regularly organised. As such, temporary garden shows, floral exhibitions, dance and street art all regularly feature to the great pleasure of the Gardens' French, German and international visitors.

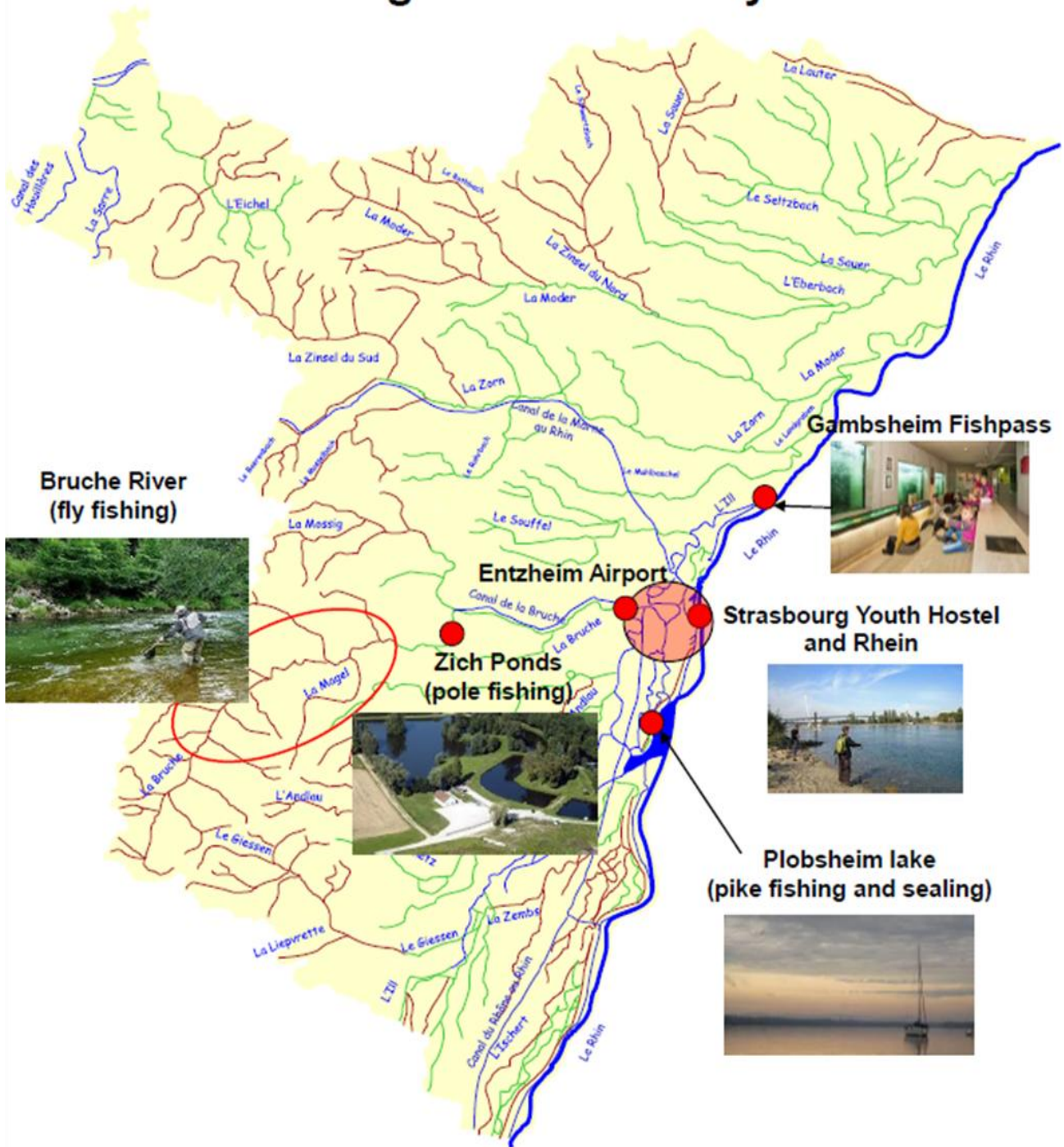

Angling competition at the Zich-Molsheim ponds:

The fishing competition will result in a team and individual ranking.

Participants will be able to fish using rods, and English techniques using reels will be allowed. Dominant species are roach, bream and carp.



Teams may bring their own equipment but equipment will also be available if necessary. Please indicate when you register if you would like equipment to be provided for your team.

Lures and bait for the competition will be provided and will be the same for all teams (bloodworms and maggots).

Introduction to tying flies:

Participants will be able to discover and learn how to tie flies with our professional leaders and volunteers.

All equipment for the activity will be provided, and our young participants will be able to take their works of art home with them.



Introduction to fly fishing in the Bruche valley:

The main waterway for trout in the department, the Bruche has everything to truly please trout fishing fans. The Bruche also has a lovely grayling population.

Our young anglers will be introduced to the art of fly fishing on this magnificent river.

All equipment for the activity will be provided, however participants are also welcome to bring their own equipment.



Street fishing in Strasbourg and discovering Asp fishing on the Rhine (lure fishing):

Fishing in the city? Yes, it's possible! And it has even become a widespread trend in France known as street fishing.

Our young anglers will be able to compete against each other by fishing for carnivorous species using lures. The morning's objective will be to encounter the Asp! This incredible sport fish is the symbol of urban fishing in Strasbourg. Emotions are guaranteed to run high when they bite!

All equipment for the activity will be provided, however participants are also welcome to bring their own equipment.



Visit of the Gamsheim fish ladder:

In the afternoon, we will take a tour boat on the Rhine i to visit the Gamsheim fish ladder.

With the construction of the hydroelectric power station on the Rhine, the question arose as to how to protect the migration of salmon and other fish that were blocked from running up the river. This fish ladder was designed and inaugurated in 2006.

Open to the general public, this fish ladder has an extraordinary observation room.



The museum and information area provide extensive information on the ecosystem of the Rhine and the fish that inhabit it.

This visit highlights another important commitment of fishing associations in France: the protection of aquatic environments and their fish.



Visit of the city Strasbourg:



At the crossroads of Europe, Strasbourg is an intense concentration of Alsatian culture. This vibrant and unusual city lies on the border with Germany. Home to the European Parliament, Strasbourg is not simply a city in the country, but a true European metropolis.

Strasbourg is also an historic city of culture, with plenty to see and do, replete with remarkable monuments such as the Palais Rohan and Cathedral. Visiting the city is extremely pleasant and culturally fascinating...



You will also be able to admire the incredibly charming Petite France district, with its canals and timbered houses. Strasbourg's heritage is remarkably well preserved and gives the city its distinctive character.



Fishing for predatory fish by boat (pike, perch)/sailing on the lake:

Our young anglers will be able to enjoy an entire day at Plobsheim lake.

Covering 660 hectares, Plobsheim is the largest body of water in the department. This artificial lake is quite shallow (3m depth on average) and its clear water is home to an extensive flora. It is the basis for an exceptional ecosystem. Roach, tench, perch and even catfish thrive, but it is the extensive number of large pike that make this a unique destination.



As the group will be split into two, participants have the chance to discover and take part in two different activities:

- Sailing



- Lure fishing and boat fishing for predatory fish



Both activities will be led by qualified professionals who have experience in running these activities according to optimal safety conditions.

All equipment for the activity will be provided, however participants are also welcome to bring their own equipment.

Please bring a swimming costume and towel.
